ROLE: Cycling Instructor x2

CONTRACT: 6 months (Contractor), immediate start.

HOURS: 3 hours per week (minimum) + hours for one-on-one support sessions

ORGANISATION: Bristol Muslim Cultural Society (BMCS)

REPORTS TO: Cycling Sisters Project Manager

PURPOSE OF ROLE:

To deliver Cycling Sisters' Learn to Ride 6 Week course to 2 small groups of women (4-5 people) per cohort acting as a teacher/facilitator.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES:

- To deliver the cycling course as per the structured plan.
- To ensure all BMCS protocols are adhered to during cycling sessions.
- Demonstrate good time management and a strong commitment to cycling sessions.

JOB OVERVIEW

You will be part of the BMCS Cycling Sisters Team. You will have a unique platform to support and develop by engaging with women teaching and aiding them in a key skill of riding a bicycle. Previous experience of working with women and proficient in riding a bicycle on-road and off-road settings is preferable. Training will be provided if needed.

Cycling Instructor will run sessions once a week – dependent on their preference of either Thursday (during school hours) or Sunday (afternoon), with the potential of doing both days. In addition, facilitating one-on-one support sessions with participants outside of the sessions on ad-hoc basis.

Applicants must be 18 years or older, be fluent in English and female. Having an additional language would be advantageous but not necessary. Pay is per session. Having a current and valid UK driver's license is preferred.
